Abstract: On July 14, 1965, Eddie Jr. and Alice Marie Crimmins disappeared from their home, later to be found murdered. Their mother, Alice Crimmins, became the number one suspect in their death. This collection contains the Queens County District Attorney's investigative files into the crime, which were used to indict, and eventually convicted, Alice Crimmins for the crime.

Biographical/Historical Note

On the morning of July 14, 1965, Eddie Crimmins, Jr., aged five and Alice Marie "Missy" Crimmins, aged four, disappeared from their Kew Gardens Hills home. The children's father, Edmund ("Eddie") Crimmins called the police at approximately 11 AM to report the disappearance of the children after frantic calls from his estranged wife, Alice Crimmins.

It became known very quickly that Alice and her husband Eddie were in the middle of an acrimonious divorce. Alice was painted as an attractive woman who spent a great deal of time out of the house with various suitors and her alleged main boyfriend, Anthony Grace, drinking and dancing. These assumptions would play heavily against her with the police, the media and the general public.

In September 1967, following an investigation into the disappearance of the two young children, with little to no concrete evidence found, an indictment was filed against Alice Crimmins by the Queens County District Attorney's Office for the murder of her daughter, Alice Marie. She was convicted on the charges in 1968, but upon appeal, the conviction was overturned and a new trial was ordered. Her 1971 trial convicted her for the murder of her son and manslaughter of her daughter. The murder charge of her son was then reversed by the Appellate Division, who confirmed the manslaughter conviction in May 1975. Alice Crimmins was released on parole in November 1977.

Once out of prison, Alice married Anthony who had visited her regularly in prison. The couple moved to Key Largo, Florida. Since then, there have been various books, articles, and documentaries about the case, with no definitive answer to who committed the murders of Eddie and Alice Marie Crimmins.

Scope and Content Note

The Queens County District Attorney's Alice Crimmins case file, closed case file #1619-67, is arranged into five series. The first two series are based on the chronological lifespan of the two trials. Series I primarily contains documentation from the beginning of the investigation to the end of the first trial. Series II encompasses the appeals process and second trial and includes materials used or copied from the first trial. In Series III, the items are organized by the format of the documents. It contains photographs and maps from the investigation and trials; many are oversized. Series IV contains the original newspapers and news clippings, which discuss the murders during both the first and second trial. Series V is a collection of 72 reel-to-reel audio tapes and four CDs of recorded conversations mostly from phone taps.

Arrangement

Although the first two series are organized alphabetically, they are based on the chronological lifespan of the two trials. The records are divided into five series:

Series I: District Attorney case files

Date(s): 1964-1969

Size (Extent): 2.5 cubic feet (5 boxes)

Scope and Content: This series contains both handwritten and typewritten documents from the DA's office, concerning the investigation and first trial of Alice Crimmins. Included are documents ranging from the years 1964-1969, although the bulk of the material is dated 1964-1968. The police complaint reports against Alice Crimmins, trial transcripts, and some of the medical and autopsy reports for her daughter, Missy, can be found here.

Files on the Court Proceedings (series 1, box 1, folders 3-9) contain incomplete transcripts from certain days of the hearings. There are also transcripts of testimony given by most of the witnesses, for both the prosecution and defense. This includes statements made by Alice Crimmins, as well as by her husband Eddie. Most of the transcripts bear handwritten notes made by the DA during witness questioning. Located under the title "Testimony" in boxes 4 and 5, folders 60-83, there are individual folders for each witness. Witnesses for the defense were labeled as such; there is no indication of which witnesses were testifying for the prosecution.

Evidence presented at trial is also included in this series, such as local weather and electrical outage reports from the night of the murder. The physical evidence, separated from the manuscripts, includes address books belonging to Alice Crimmins and her alleged boyfriend, Anthony Grace, fingerprints, clothing of the children, and microscope slides containing tissue samples from the body of Missy. See folder 21 for separation sheets detailing their original location within the series files. Additional pieces of evidence are in box 1, folders 17-22.

Series II: Appeals case files

Date(s): 1965-1971

Size (Extent): 2 cubic feet (4 boxes)

Scope and Content: In December 1969, the Appellate Division of the New York Supreme Court ordered a new trial after several jurors secretly paid a visit to the crime scene, claiming they did so to verify the plausibility of Sophie Earomirski's testimony. (Earomirski's eyewitness testimony had been paramount in convicting Crimmins during the first trial). In the court's opinion, "the net effect of the jurors' visits was that they made themselves secret, untested witnesses not subject to any cross-examination." The Court of Appeals, New York State's highest court, agreed, and in 1971, the case was retried.

This series contains documents used in the case of this appeal and for the new trial. Although there are some documents from 1965, most are from 1969-1971. Several transcripts of witness testimony given during the new trial are included. Both the appellant's brief and the appellant's reply brief can be found in this series. They give a detailed timeline of the investigation and first trial, as well as what happened in the Crimmins family before the murders took place (series 2, box 1, folder 10). There is information concerning the juror Harry Tunis, from the first trial, who was accused of judging Crimmins guilty before hearing all evidence; he also one of the jurors who visited the crime scene. Medical papers and other documents discussing him can be located in the folder under his name. The summation of the trial can be found in box 3, folder 30.

Series III: Maps and photographs

Date(s): 1966-1971

Size (Extent): 0.5 cubic feet (1 box)

Scope and Content: This series contains maps and photographs from the trial and investigation. Folders 1-6 contain maps of the crime scene and surrounding areas. These maps range from very small and specific spots, like the floor plan of Crimmins' apartment, to much larger maps of the Kew Gardens neighborhood and the jurisdiction of the 108th precinct in Queens. Several of the maps have handwritten markings on them showing either the locations of suspects or where the children's bodies were found. The next six folders contain 58 photographs that are separated into six categories. They include photos of the body of Alice Marie as well as pictures showing the stomach contents that were taken during the autopsy. There are also images showing the crime scene, both close-ups and aerials. In some of the photographs of the crime scene where you cannot clearly see the body, it has been marked off in ink.

Series V: Audiotapes

Date(s): 1965-1971

Size (Extent): 2 cubic feet (2 boxes)

Scope and Content: This series contains 72 reel-to-reel tape recordings of phone conversations from wiretaps placed on Alice Crimmins' telephone calls, as well as others the police suspected of being involved in the crime. All the tapes were numbered although they appear to be in different groupings. Some have just a number while others are titled "Tel-W," presumably for "telephone wiretaps," and are followed by a number. There are three tapes titled "Int," presumably short for "interview." These originally contained folded pieces of paper inside the box, which appear to be handwritten transcripts of what was on the tapes. The handwritten transcripts were placed with the printed transcripts in series 1, box 4, folder 59. Most tapes are labeled with a date; their chronological arrangement has been retained. Included also is a sample of tapes that were reformatted to CDs. The original recordings for these are still in the series.
